
At-Home Engineering Activity Programming

The Society of Women Engineers created an athome engineering program called SWEductational to make these activities more accessible for students as well as teach them about different engineering disciplines. We did a joint project on creating a video that focuses on Water Resources Engineering and building your own mini watershed. Volunteers helped to create the video on walking through the different steps of building a mini watershed and had to option of building it themselves for the video.

New Student Workshop

This was a workshop for incoming freshmen and transfer students. Our goal was to provide new students with resources and tricks of the trade to make the transition to Cal Poly Engineering easier. We had a Q&A panel consisting of students within the CE department and staff from different organizations such as Engineering Student Services and the Transfer Center. 
